Online Meeting Makeup Procedure

Sometimes it is more convenient to make up a missed meeting online rather than by visiting another Club. The Online Makeup function provides this option.

The process for doing this is very simple and takes at least 30 minutes to qualify as a legitimate makeup.. In addition, as you would if you visited another Club, you are asked to pay at least \$10 to the Club that maintains the web site.

You can access the **Online Makeup** function from our Fayetteville Rotary Home Page, on left side below Rotary International. Or you can enter the following web site to go directly to the "eClub One" web site - <http://www.rotaryclubone.org/>. This site is maintained by the Rotary eClubOne of District 5450 in Colorado. It contains some 20 programs online and another 100 on an archive which can be accessed directly from their site.

When you go to the eClub One web site, you will be shown a menu of information and options. One of the options is called **Rotary eClub One Make-Up Programs** which will take you to a list of short descriptions of the 20+ available programs and the archives options. You click on the **Show Program** option beside the program you want to view. I chose three which took only about 15 minutes but I also spent some time to gather info on the site for this newsletter article. Many are one page of text while others may include videos of a talk, trip photos and some describe service projects done by Clubs.

After you have spent the required 30 minutes of time, you can request a **Make-Up Request** form to provide proof to our Club secretary of your valid make up. This form will request your name, Club name, District Number, and an email to send the completed form. I used my own email and printed the form to give to Marsha. You will be asked to list the programs you have viewed for this make up and give a rating (1 - 5) and offer any comments on the program.

You then are asked to offer comments on the web site and how you may use what you have seen.

The first time I visited eClub One, I watched a video of a talk by author Thomas Friedman on his book "The World Is Flat" which was quite interesting and made me go ahead and read the book.

I have not visited the other website for International Clubs but would imagine one could find many things of interest there as well.

Try it, you may just like it. But come to our Club meetings when you can.

Meeting Makeup at another Club

The most common way to make up a missed meeting is by attending one of our area Clubs or a one in another town if visiting there. Generally you are expected to pay the Club you visit for a meal just as you do when attending one of our meetings. Actually you will be billed for a meal by our Club if you do not make up elsewhere.

If you visit the Fayetteville Northside Club meeting on Tuesday noon at the Cosmopolitan, you can take advantage of the reciprocation they have with our Club. They will notify our Club that you have attended and your meal cost will be billed on your normal bill as if you had attended our meeting. Other clubs in our area and meeting times are:
